GLOSSARY

ABDESTHANA	A place for a ritual wash next to a mosque
AG(H)A	In the Ottoman Empire the title of a high court dignitary, the commander of a military unit, a rich nobleman and landowner, or a well-to-do citizen.
ALAYBEY	(Turkish) commander of <i>spahis</i> in a <i>sanjak</i> ; colonel
ATIK	Turkish word meaning "old", usually denotes the oldest (the first to be built) mosque in town or village.
BEG or BEY	Nobleman, lord, dignitary, as a title it is attributed to the personal name as a sign of respect; in Ottoman feudal system, a higher rank than <i>ag(h)a</i> .
ČELEBIJA	From Turkish " <i>celebi</i> ": a noble, from a good family, usually given with the names of princes and intellectuals.
ČESMA	(Public) water fountain.
ČIFLUK	A type of estate usually governed by usually Muslim landlords.
ČEHAJA	Vizier's assistant, a head person, a leader of a trade or craftsman's guild, high civil servant.
DIZDAR	Military commander of a fort or a town.
EFENDIJA	A title given to a learned person, usually Moslem
EPISKOP	Orthodox bishop.
EYALET	In the Ottoman Empire, a province or administrative unit (<i>beylerbeyluk</i>) ruled by a governor (<i>beylerbey</i>).
GASULHANA	A room where the dead are washed and prepared for a burial.
HAJJI (HADŽI)	An attribute given to a Moslem who went to a holy pilgrimage to Mekka, and performed a <i>hajj</i> , as one of the five duties in Islam; sometimes the same title is given to an Orthodox who did the pilgrimage to Jerusalem.
HAMAM	Public bath.
HAREM	Part of a house reserved for women; here also in the meaning of a graveyard.
HAVRA	Jewish temple.
KHOJA (HODŽA)	Moslem priest; religious teacher.
IMAM	Moslem priest whose main duty is to lead the congregation during the collective prayer (<i>namaz</i>) in the mosque.
IMARET	Public kitchen set up by a wealthy legator where the poor and/or travelers and certain <i>madrasah</i> students were entitled to have a free meal.
ISLAMIC BOARD PREMISES	A body within the structure of Islamic (religious) community which runs all the activities in the territorial distribution, including control and use of donated and bequeathed legacies (<i>vakuf</i>).
JEMAAT	Moslem religious community/district on the territory of one mosque or imam.
KAPETAN	Captain, here in the sense of commander.
MADRASAH	Moslem higher (secondary) religious school, the school children attend once they complete their education in <i>mekteb</i> .
MAHALA	Town quarter, a part of a town or a village, sometimes also in the meaning of a town street



MASJID	Moslem religious edifice without a <i>minaret</i> .
MEKTEB	Moslem primary religious school.
MEZARISTAN	Moslem graveyard.
MINARET	A slim tower adjacent to a mosque from where an <i>imam</i> or <i>muezzin</i> calls the Muslim for the prayer five times a day.
MOSQUE	Moslem religious edifice with one or several minarets, a place of worship.
MUSAFIRHANA	In the Ottoman period, a public inn where travelers could have a free lodging and a meal for the three consecutive days.
MOUSALLA	Moslem open prayer ground.

NIŠAN	A gravestone on a Muslim grave.
PASHA	A title given to a high Ottoman dignitary, either military or civil servant.
SAHAT KULA	Clock tower.
SHAHID (ŠEHID)	A soldier who died in the battle for the faith.
SHEIKH (ŠEJH)	A leader, a head of dervishes.
STEĆAKS	Medieval stone gravestones (13th to 16th centuries) in Bosnia and Herzegovina, having the form of a tablet, obelisk, sarcophagus, box, or cross and sometimes decorated with ornaments and figures.

TEKKE (TEKIJA)	A <i>dervish</i> building, usually in Bosnia near the water where dervishes perform their prayers and other religious rites, similar to a monastery (in the broadest sense of a word), same as <i>zaviyye</i> .

VAKUF	A foundation, legacy or landed property that is voluntarily donated (bequeathed) by a legator (<i>vakif</i>) to the community for general use (as a rule, to the Islamic religious foundation, educational and humanitarian institution), the real estate and personal property connected to the real estate could be donated to a vakuf, which was inalienable.
VEZIR (VIZIER)	Minister, governor, a ruler of the province in Ottoman Empire.

0.0 INTRODUCTION

0.1. INTRODUCTORY REMARKS

A desire to register all the devastations of the cultural, historical and natural heritage of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina in the period 1992-1995 was a rather difficult assignment due to the war circumstances and problems in communications with the country's free territories. The territories currently under a temporary occupation could not be reached and properly examined, so the actual situation there was somewhat dubious and could not be verified with a precision and certainty.

The data gathered by the Institute were checked to a large extent through various relevant bodies and institutions.

This report came as a result of the endeavour undertaken by the staff of the Institute for Protection of Cultural, Historical and Natural Heritage of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina in Sarajevo, and it represents our insight into the current situation **until September 5, 1995**. The Report's list includes all the monuments which had been followed by our Institute as categorized, registered and protected edifices, but also for those which had been thought as neglected for various reasons in the protection procedures although they stood as historical, ambience, artistic or cultural and historical values of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

The Institute's Register listed 7,723 cataloging units in the heritage of Bosnia and Herzegovina - from the archeological findings and sites to edifices, artifacts, books and artistic valuables.

The manner of presentation for the actual state of destruction was adequate to the simpler usage and it was listed according to the intensity and number that the enemy had chosen as its goal of destruction. The list attached is far from being final, and the complete insight would be possible once the war stopped, when the more precise observations could be expected on the level of destruction of each particular edifice, or a conclusion could be drawn that certain rarity permanently disappeared.

We do not expect some essential corrections to happen in a positive sense. Our predictions are rather ominous.

The data we had acquired could be already treated as incomplete due to the situation in various parts of the country.

1.0 THE REGISTERED LIST OF CULTURECIDE IN BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

1.1. NATURAL HERITAGE

The war devastations had their impact on the damages and destructions of natural heritage. The famous National Museum's Botanical Garden was completely destroyed together with its fine collections of rare plants and endemic species. Many rare types of plants were also destroyed or damaged. The forests on the Mount Trebević overlooking the City of Sarajevo were not spared from the war activities, as well as the Mount Igman, Mount Bjelašnica, Mount Treskavica, the high plateaus of Herzegovina in the south and in Bosanska Krajina, in the northwestern parts of the country. These parts of the country also suffered from the lack of controlled felling and hauling away of timber. According to some information, the largest European virgin forest "Perućica" saw intensive felling activities, and on some parts of the Mount Romanija the total felling had taken place which left large areas barren of any trees.

The eastern Bosnia, where the fiercest battles were fought, and which had throughout its large territory separate sites of the endemic species of Serbian spruce (*Picea omorika*), which had been declared to be under protection, were damaged or completely destroyed.

War destructions had some ruinous effects on many natural sites, on landscapes, particularly in the Una River, the Pliva River and the Neretva River Valleys, respectively.

A systematic destruction of a rare flora and fauna was registered, many of the species having been endemic or almost extinct.

Geomorphological monuments in caves are underground Karst region phenomena which could be usually found in mountainous areas rich in limestone. Many of them are characterized by different deposits of crystalline calcium carbonate and a rare cavernous fauna, and because of these properties they had been under protection. We could not leave out a possibility that these structures of natural heritage were, at times, used for war purposes, such as shelters, weapons arsenals or a kind of warehouse. Certain cavernous ornaments were definitely damaged, or even destroyed in the course of these activities. If one bore in mind that it took thousands of years for these ornaments to be formed, one could get a more precise picture of the irreparable damages inflicted on these speleological monuments.

1.2. ARCHEOLOGICAL SITES AND OLD MEDIEVAL TOWNS

As a rule, these cultural and historical edifices were located on higher grounds, hills and dominant positions which served in this war for the aggressor for a concentration of its heavy weapons. Since such places are specially fortified and protected in order to defend kept positions, we are certain that a remarkable cultural and historical material was disturbed, destroyed or removed there.

Many Neolithic hill-forts, old towns, castles, burgs and towers, with many layers of historical and continuous traditional values, sedimented from the Neolithic to the Middle Ages, would be irretrievably lost.

There is an evident danger for some 1,000-1,200 archeological sites, and we could not ascertain how many old towns, and there had been more than 300 of them in Bosnia and Herzegovina, would survive this war.

1.3. SEPULCHRAL MONUMENTS

Since burial grounds show and prove a territorial and ethnic continuity of a particular people on the specific land area, they were the particular target in the war. The overall number is not possible to declare since most of these sites are not accessible, but it is known that some of them have been flattened by bulldozers, the monuments crushed down, and the traces of graveyards, especially the Moslem mezaristans, virtually disappeared.

The burial grounds of a Neolithic Man were either destroyed or shelled, the ancient peoples' necropolis, the Bogumil sepulchral heritage from the Middle Ages, and especially Oriental and Islamic (Moslem) grave sites, as well as those who were considered active as multireligious ones, and which served the purpose until the beginning of this war in 1992. Many other graveyards which were the last repose for the victims of this war from 1992-1995, were also brutally destroyed.

The whole burying complexes and the sepulchral architecture and cultural heritage monuments could not be even identified, whereas the other sites were transformed into waste dumps, parking lots and similar places which shows the lack of civilization nature and ethnic hatred of those who had committed such abominations.



1.4. MOVABLE CULTURAL AND HISTORICAL HERITAGE

In regard to the number of destroyed sacral and profane edifices in the immovable cultural edifices, the movable treasure was thoroughly destroyed, stolen, or simply "disappeared". The protection departments are powerless even to register the mass character of covering the traces in this type of heritage. Of course, there were some instances when some people put away or placed under the safe control certain monuments, but these were the isolated cases where some individuals acted upon their own conscience in a certain institution, or these activities were carried out by some independent organized groups under the legal authorities' control.

All religious communities in Bosnia and Herzegovina put away their valuables in an organized way for the benefit of their own interests. We do not have a proper evidence about these monuments. The institutions which had been supposed to register such monuments in the past, showed a lack of their interest for this matter, which, as a result, made their own collections rather small in size and value.

The treasure which belonged to the Serbian Orthodox Church was mostly taken away or transferred to the other territories before the beginning of the war.

Some Roman Catholic monasteries and their monks carefully put away their rarities into the depots and only they knew the exact whereabouts. Many Roman Catholic monasteries were deliberately burned down as a part of a detailed, carefully planned system, particularly those ones which had housed precious library collections, which was the general purpose of culturecide.

There are some indications that some foreign humanitarian organizations, some individuals and the whole "chains" of international black market trade took away considerable works of art from the public galleries, private collections, as well as from the abandoned apartments and houses or religious edifices. Channels and a number of such a trade are not exactly known to the cultural heritage protection departments.

The list of the movable cultural and historical heritage was not accumulated in a single, central institution before the war, so this work is necessarily incomplete under the war circumstances in our relevant departments. We do expect that the next report in this field would be more comprehensive than the current one.

1.5. HISTORICAL URBAN AMBIENCE ENSEMBLES

The urbicide against a homogenous urban ambience ensembles in Bosnia and Herzegovina (defined at the beginning of the Middle Ages with the arrival of the Ottoman Turks) did not manage to encompass all the places throughout the country. Nevertheless, it was estimated, that each and single traditional urban ambience ensemble had been shelled or burned down. It is well known that the most important part of the historical ensemble could be found in its central core - a downtown (or *čaršija* /from the Turkish word *carsi* meaning center, or market place, bazaar/) and the residential areas. The culturecide planners acted upon their own logic about the criteria on the level of urbanity which consisted of edifices and other civilization accomplishments. They definitely tried to destroy the cultural and religious features of certain communities.

Bosnia and Herzegovina had more than one hundred traditional urban ambience ensembles and settlements. Thirty eight of them had a well preserved cultural, historical and traditional foundations, whereas twenty settlements had a partially preserved cultural and historical foundations. All of them suffered great damages and destructions in the period between 1992 to 1995.

The damages inflicted on the particular buildings endangered to a great extent their ambience values, characteristics and their rarity. Many of them are irretrievably lost. The excessive use of massive explosive devices or the application of the burning methods, permanently destroy the unique particular features of these traditional structures.

Some specific traits of the culturecide in Bosnia and Herzegovina could be seen in the fact of its massive application, the impossibility to provide an effective prevention protection before the beginning of the war, and particularly during the war. This also includes the lack of proper repair and reconstruction once the destruction or devastation was committed. Since most of the regions included in the war zones happen to be in the Continental or even in the Alpine climate conditions, rains, snow, and other precipitations with low temperatures in winter, and comparatively high ones in summer, could only make the actual situation with the endangered monuments rather worse in due time.

The infrastructure, such as bridges from the Antiquity, The Ottoman stone buildings with the high monument categories attached to them, the contemporary or more recent structures from the Period of Secession to the Modern Age, the ancient viaducts, sources and water supply systems, the basic functional elements for urban structures, were devastated and destroyed to such an extent that some of them were considered endangered on the national level.

On the peripheral parts of Bosnia and Herzegovina - the regional and those next to the country's border - the well known historical, urban and rural ambience ensembles, notably those from the Ottoman Turks Period, were devastated or even gone completely. Devastations were particularly considerable and precise on the strategic corridors and locations important for their ground and transportation features.



According to the investigations conducted, the destructions were carried out on the intensive scale on the following historical urban ensembles:

Banja Luka, Bihać, Blagaj, Bosanska Krupa, Brčko, Cazin, Čajniče, Čapljina, Doboј, Foča, Fojnica, Gračanica, Gradačac, Jajce, Konjic, Kozarac, Kreševo, Livno, Maglaj, Mostači near Trebinje, Mostar, Počitelj, Prijedor, Prozor, Prusac, Rogatica, Sarajevo, Srebrenica, Stolac, Tešanj, Travnik, Trebinje, Tuzla, Vareš, Visoko, Višegrad, Vranduk and Zvornik.

In the settlements, which had seen in the past negative transformations, the preserved parts of this cultural and historical heritage were devastated in:

Bijeljina, Bosanska Dubica, Bosanski Novi, Busovača, Bužim, Bugojno, Derventa, Glamoč, Hutovo, Jeleč, Jezero near Jajce, Ključ, Kraljeva Sutjeska, Kulen Vakuf, Ljubuški, Neum, Olovo, Rudo, Turbe, Velika Kladuša and Vitez.

1.6. RURAL TRADITIONAL AMBIENCE ENSEMBLES

Bosnia and Herzegovina is a territory with more than 7,500 rural settlements. They are mostly (especially those with 300-500 inhabitants) small, autarkic (self reliant), and, according to all their features, with their own traditional ways of life and architectural articulation. As a rule, they were established on the outskirts of the higher grounds. One could find above them the remnants of the Neolithic and medieval hill-forts, old fortified towns, castles, fortresses and guard posts. The number of these settlements is considerable, which could be seen from the data taken from The Statistics listings, and it could also be an indicator of the mass character of such a way of life on the country's territory. The protection departments followed and registered such monuments only partly. The special treatment was given to the rural settlements on the outskirts of the Sarajevo municipalities (7), namely: Stari Grad (= Old Town) Municipality - four; Novo Sarajevo (= New Sarajevo) - ten; Ilidža - one; Pale - four; Ilijaš - seven; and Trnovo - twenty two. Some villages in Bosanska Krajina and Lower Herzegovina were also fragmentarily observed. The fringes of the Karst fields in Herzegovina abound with traditional villages of longitudinal and sticking out types respectively. Certain agglomerations were formed in the ancient times. These examples of rural architecture are gone in flames or by a planted explosive. The northern, hilly region towards the Sava River was rich with the traditional rural settlements (although a proper valorization of cultural and historical heritage was not carried out). It was also the target of culturecide. The Neolithic settlement close to Ripač, near Bihać, was under the constant war activities, although it had been included into the World Prehistory Heritage.

One could draw conclusions from all what had been written above, that the traditional rural ambience ensembles in Bosnia and Herzegovina represented the most numerous devastated complexes and agglomerations in the period of this war. The burnt, destroyed or abandoned cultural and historical values in the villages could not even be listed properly, but it was estimated that several hundreds of them had disappeared completely. many of them were the real rarities of the historical ambience ensembles on the Balkans.

REFLECTIONS ON THE PUBLIC EXECUTION OF BOSNIA'S CULTURAL HERITAGE

Philosophical anthropology affirms that, congenially with the Holy Texts, existence of human culture comes out, partly, from Man's bodily lack of preparation for and its inadequacy to Nature. There is hardly a weaker offspring than the human one in the rich variety of species on this earth. It comes to this world without scales, fur, feather and/or goat's hair. Claws are out of question, and the human jaws could satisfy better an aesthetics of smile rather than the common practice of biting, tearing or crushing the food! Within a more developed outline of such a line of thinking, one could only feel sorry for him/her; and, among many definitions already offered about its presence and existence, Man could be defined as **a being wearing clothes, as a being who gets dressed!** Anthropologists and theologians alike would prefer to argue immensely about this corporal retardation of homo sapiens on two legs. They claim that Man, as soon as it is born, is received, together with its mother's smile, with culture, with a quite simple but consistent cultural fact, such as diapers, for instant!

Culture is, in short and without any fear to make a major mistake, that what is left from the Man's world once you deduct "biology" from it, although there is no culture without Nature, without all this "biology". All cultural facts, all cultural features are closely related to the Man's world only. Animals do not make a step out of that world, they do not even try to conceive an attempt to acquire a different look at and understand the world. A spider, for instance, from the "very Beginning" weaves its web in the same way, as much as bees, whether the African or European ones, relate in the same manner and with the same movements to their beehives where is a direction of their meadows, where the sun light and warmth aroused the juices from flowers.

The Holy Texts, and after them almost all kinds of anthropology, particularly their philosophical provenance, attribute to culture its solemn, holy, elevated meaning and importance. There is not a single Holy Book which does not tell about that the Dear Lord, the Magnificent Creator, inspired Man how to perceive shame, how to cover its naked body with leaves, how to make its dwellings! We can never be thankful enough to the Holy Word that had never placed Man into the caves already prepared by Nature, but in the midst of temples which allure from the depth of heavenly blue, with the call of this wondrous veil, why not say clothes, that covers and uncovers at the same time the Greatest of all the Secrets!

Architecture has its foundations in the fact of clothing, and the very fact of clothing and building of dwellings had always been given a pretext and context of holy culture. There are some opinions that architecture is an extended clothing; what clothing represents for Man, the architecture is for the People! Nations cover themselves in their architectures! Types of clothing and building, dressing and dwelling could be followed closely in any period of human history. One could feel comfortable when living in a certain city, one's look feels at ease and has the sense of space in the same way your bosom feels in a shirt woven from the fine fabric...

These or similar words of introduction are necessary when we want to speak on Bosnia, on a wide variety of its types of dressing, dwelling, cultures and architectures. Especially because, this book you have in your hands speak about the devastated and destroyed and desecrated Bosnia from its east to its west borders.

The ignorant persons must always be told what Bosnia is, or, at least, they must try to realize what Bosnia was! It is a landscape on this earth where the great world's ideas and religions: Islam, Catholicism, Judaism, Orthodox Christianity and Manichaeism, met each other during longer periods of peace in a peculiar and natural way dictated by no one! It is a living University of comparative studies of the better part of world's religions, the meeting point between the East and the West through a medium made of the mutually similar autochthonous human material! It is a unique environment where religions spread through the Bosnian valleys and mountains in an unsystematic manner, having made an interesting pattern, a mosaic of incomparable rarity, beauty and spontaneity.

The architectures of Bosnia, which, most often, grew out on the traditions of these great religions of the world, could affirm all which had already been said. In Bosnia, one could easily read out the history of all these people who had stubbornly loved Bosnia as their homeland. Architectures spread in time and space; in a way, they grew out from the cultures that came to Bosnia. The previous traces were not necessarily wiped out; in short, Bosnia was fortunate to have been a country where a continuity of dissimilarities persisted, where history did not start all over, again and again and so many times, but it was received, followed and saw off through its own continuity!

Bosnia, therefore, never became a museum in itself, Bosnia could not be understood properly if it was seen through museum eyes. Chimes of different times, calendars and clocks from the sacred architectures of Sarajevo and Bosnia do not represent a sound of hatred but they happen to be a sacred gift where different cultures came across each other at the natural meeting point, and where everybody remained what it had used to be. Bosnia shows in the best way that there could be no proper humanity with a single counting of time, with a single glimpse towards the paths of stars. This country is, in fact, a reality, a life, a cluster of jugular veins that represent a large portions of humanity. This could be seen from the intertwined types of its architectures and building styles.



The very fact that Islamic mosques, Jewish synagogues, Catholic cathedrals and Orthodox churches respectively, could stay very near to each other must be accepted as the fact of life, of the long period of time where these five religious cultures, or cultural religions (Manichaeism, Islam, Catholicism, Judaism and Orthodox Christianity) lived and became mutually substituted without colonizing each other. Religions spread in Bosnia, religions in Bosnia had no colonizing or colonizers' effects! This could be seen in culture and architecture of Sarajevo and many other Bosnian towns! Bosnia never became the landscape of one religion only, whatever the time span of certain empire persisted over Bosnia. Bosnia never became a monolithic country, the country overpowered by the single religion of the then ruling empire. Nevertheless, the spread and presence of Islam in Bosnia during the rule of Ottoman Empire from the Fifteenth to the Nineteenth Century left a large number of mosques, masjids, mektebs, madrasahs, hamams, caravanserais and many other monuments closely associated with this religion and its particularly urban cultural facets. They were built both side by side with the monuments of other religions, but also as brand new buildings which would become nuclei of future villages and towns, on the important roads or river crossings, as new centers of handicrafts and commerce, learning and culture. Islam added a lot to the existing scenery of Bosnia, it immersed into its landscape and emerged from it with its characteristic domes and arches, its slim minarets made of wood and stone, its courtyards and graveyards, its patterns and designs, its benefactors and master builders... It was a living and vital culture whose features, despite the change of rulers and regimes, could be felt and seen vividly until our times.

In Anno Domini 1992, 1993, 1994... and who knows how many more years still to pass, there were the times when Bosnia was destroyed and devastated. These times came as an early and ugly bad omen, although one could not yet read into the future of even worse and more hideous signs. But, it was obvious that treading over the remnants of broken tiles, roofs, bricks, burnt wood, facades, pillars, domes and stones meant a destruction of the centuries long Bosnian times of multicultural dignity and tolerance.

Bosnia saw many wars and conquerors, but none of them tried, as the current attackers, to eradicate Bosnia from its very roots. A false and immoral euphemism "ethnic cleansing", accepted without proper questioning what it really implied in its essence throughout Europe and the West, contained an intention of eradication, expulsion, annihilation and extermination, in fact it defiled rather than "cleansed" the multicultural landscape of Bosnia, mostly at the expense of its Islamic and Bosniak components.

The facts offered in this book are the distressing testimony of destruction of Islamic beauty, architecture and culture in Bosnia. At the same time, it was not only the destruction of nicely cut and composed stones and stone and wooden edifices, which remind us of the music transformed into the form of sacred buildings; but it also meant the destruction of the magnificent idea of Man's living with all that it was rightfully only his, with all its Whole and Unity, but only next to the Whole and Unity that belonged to his fellow Man and neighbour, similar but different! It was, in short, the idea of Bosnia!

This book with its attempt to record available data on the devastation and destruction of the Islamic religious and cultural structures together with the people who continued to be persecuted, tortured, expelled from their homes, and murdered and burned with the edifices of their Islamic faith and culture of living; testifies, among many other documents, about the public execution of the very idea of Bosnia. It traces the origins of one of its important constituents, the Islamic one, and it follows its gradual spread and development together with the names of known or forgotten benefactors and founders, from Sultans and feudal lords to wealthy citizens and humble merchants, the amount of money they left for supporting their legacies, the number of households which grew around the places of worship, the travellers who described them and those who studied the archives and other records or provided the relevant data after having visited every single place in Bosnia with Islamic monuments. It is by no means a comprehensive study, but, at least, it gives a large overview on the scope of the Islamic monuments' destruction in the worst part of Bosnia's history. If it motivates other scholars to try to recreate Bosnia's cultural past with more details and precision, perhaps some of these monuments will be restored by future legators and benefactors inspired by the memory of their ancestors and tradition they belong to not only because of their origins, but also of their choice to keep on living, restoring and building in Bosnia of the future to come.

It would be sacrilegious even to say that all this destruction could, in the end, produce some good if the butchering and murdering of the idea of Bosnia and the fabric of its Islamic monuments would stop over Bosnia itself and within Bosnia! But Bosnia is the small whole world in its intertwined complexity and the destruction of its major supporting religious and cultural pillars echoes grave foreshadowings for the future of Europe and the whole world. The present Europe claimed it had strived to become what Bosnia has always been in its essence - one place with a variety of cultures and peoples. The future Europe might easily become what the attackers try to make of Bosnia now - the place of devastation and human suffering, the place of public execution. But who and where, if ever, would then make an inventory of its past and monuments turned into the ruins?

We tried to do our share in Bosnia of our times. For the sake of our dead and both for the living ones and those yet to be born who will continue to live in Bosnia of the future.
